



Describe Your Artwork/Performance Style:

In college, one of my professors defined acting as "being yourself in a completely different world from your own". That stuck with me. The idea that I am still me, but with different needs, wants, and desires. So I draw a lot from personal experience and try to root my characters in that.

When did you start making your art? Why?

Acting has been that one constant in my life. It's always been there and been a part of me. As a kid, I would put on shows for anyone and everyone who would watch. I loved the audience/performer interaction and how much can be exchanged through that. For me, there's no greater feeling than having a live audience to perform for. It's electrifying.

What is your inspiration?

I find myself inspired by other artists. It is truly a joy and a pleasure to work alongside such an amazing cast in the show. Nate Drehmer is an amazing Baker and he challenges me every rehearsal to work harder. Having people that inspire and motivate you to be a better artist is the greatest thing I could have ever asked for.

Do you make a living with your art?

At the moment, no. But that's the goal one day!

What are your current non-art jobs?

Currently, I'm working in retail and nannying.

Who is your favorite artist and why?

That such a tough question because I love artists from so many different genres, but I'd have to go with Stanley Tucci or Emily Blunt. They consistently perform well in vastly different roles and I believe it takes a great amount of skill to tackle both drama and comedy.

Where in the community can you be seen performing?

At the moment, I'm in this wonderful show called "Into the Woods" with the Community Players of Salisbury. We perform the first weekend in November. Outside of that, I can be found at many different karaoke nights and putting on some excellent performances in my car.

Death of a Salesman character descriptions

Willy Loman (60ish) - An aging salesman. He suffers from depression and anxiety as a result of his dissipating career, his estranged relationship with his oldest son, Biff, and his guilt over an extramarital affair. As the play progresses, Willy loses the ability to distinguish between the present and his memories of the past.

Linda Loman (60ish) - Willy Loman's wife. She is Willy's champion and takes it upon herself to reconcile her family. She will protect Willy at all costs, even if she must perpetuate his fantasies and deny his suicidal behavior.

Biff Loman (30ish) - The Lomans' older son. Biff has been estranged from Willy for over 15 years, during which time he has not been able to hold a steady job. Biff is the only member of the family who knows about Willy's affair, and he resents his father bitterly.

Happy Loman (30ish) -The Lomans' younger son. Happy is a womanizer driven by his sexuality. He works as an assistant but exaggerates his position and his authority.

Uncle Ben (60-70ish) - Willy's older brother. He made a fortune in the African jungle by the time he was 21 years old. He once offered Willy a job in Alaska. Ben appears in the play only in Willy's memories and fantasies.

Charley (60-70ish) - A long-time acquaintance of the Lomans. Charley supplies Willy with a weekly loan once Willy is put on straight commission, and he repeatedly offers him a job. Charlie is a true friend to Willy, even though Willy is jealous of him. Charley appears in Willy's memories, as well as in the actions of the present.

Bernard (30ish) - Charley's son. He provided Biff with answers while they were in high school and attempted to help Biff study so that he would graduate, even though Willy and Biff would criticize him. He is a successful lawyer. Bernard appears in Willy's memories, as well as in the present.

The Woman (35-50ish) - Willy's former lover, with whom he had an affair many years ago in Boston. She appears only in Willy's memories and fantasies; however, as the play progresses, Willy has difficulty distinguishing between his memories of the Woman and his memories of Linda.

Howard Wagner (40 to 50ish) - Willy's current boss. He put Willy on straight commission prior to the play's beginning, and later he fires him. Howard is a businessman, unaffected by the facts that Willy worked for his father and named him as a child.

Jenny (20-40ish) - Charley's secretary.

Stanley ((35 -55ish) - A waiter.

Miss Forsythe and **Letta** (30ish) - Two women that Happy and Biff pick up at the restaurant.

Describe Your Artwork/Performance Style:

Regarding stage and theater my heart is in musicals. My background in improv comedy has helped me be cast in many comedic relief roles, though I'm always up for branching out into a more challenging role.

When did you start making your art? Why?

There is a home video of my cousin and I fighting over a toy piano while I was still in diapers. From a young age I loved performing for anyone who would watch. I sing and I still play the piano, though I'm much better now that I'm out of diapers. I've performed in nearly 20 musicals and a dozen plays locally. I performed and taught with SU's improv group for years. In addition to performing I write music. I have about 30 half finished songs and a rough outline for a musical I've collaborated on for eight years. It's a work in progress.

What is your inspiration?

Inspiration can be found anywhere. I am always jotting down lyrics or recording melodies inspired from things I've experienced. I am surrounded by so many talented and wonderful people, their abilities and our experiences together make me want to be the best performer and musician I can be.

Do you make a living with your art?

That would be a beautiful dream come true. Over the years I've been slowly acquiring equipment and instruments to record music in the comfort of my own room. If I ever made an album and sold only one copy I'd be ecstatic. If I sold two copies that would mean that someone other than my mother bought one.

What are your current non-art jobs?

I work a couple part time jobs but I don't let that keep me from being fun and fancy free.

Who is your favorite artist and why?

It's so difficult to put a single artist on such a high pedestal, however, I have always admired Paul McCartney. The emotions he conveys through song have always spoken to me. As a teen learning my own style of performance and creativity he certainly had a huge influence on me.

Where in the community can you be seen performing?

Anywhere there is Karaoke I put on a show. I perform from time to time around town with my piano. I can also be seen performing with Community Players as often as they'll have me.
