# Auditions for The Last Five Years

Auditions for *The Last Five Years* will be held on Sunday, February 10 at 2 PM and Monday, February 11 at 7 PM at 5109 Nutters Cross Road.

The story explores a five-year relationship between Jamie Wellerstein, a rising novelist, and Cathy Hiatt, a struggling actress.

The show uses a form of storytelling in which Cathy's story is told in reverse chronological order (beginning the show at the end of the marriage), and Jamie's is told in chronological order (starting just after the couple have first met). The characters do not directly interact except for a wedding song in the middle as their timelines intersect.

Character descriptions -

Jamie - Male, Tenor, strong singing and acting. Must be able to play 20-30

Cathy - Female, Alto/Mezzo Soprano, strong singing and acting. Must be able to play 20-30.

Have a 16 bar selection of a contemporary musical theatre or pop song. No cold reading will be necessary as most of the show is singing. Sheet music or backing track will be accepted.

#### Describe Your Artwork/Performance Style:

I perform through acting and my cello in orchestral art.

#### When did you start making your art? Why?

Not many people can say they do what they love and this is why I will not stop pursuing this dream of mine until it is no longer a dream, but instead a reality.

I currently work at Lombardi's Pizzeria located in Salisbury, Maryland in the Twilley Shopping Centre.

#### Who is your favorite artist and why?

I admire many artists and I learn from numerous individuals, but my favorite artist is Yo-Yo Ma because the amount of dedication and passion which is evident in his work speaks for itself. He first started to learn how to play the cello at just 4 years old and he is everything I aspire to be and more, as I also want to explore the depths of my acting abilities.
