## FUNDRAISING UPDATE

An Old-Time Radio Show was held on June 24, raising \$668. Jammin' in July, a benefit concert for Players, was held July 29. Expectations are that we will have raised \$5000. Our August fundraiser is a Season Appreciation Celebration. Our September fundraiser is the production of Uncle Tom's Cabin and the Underground Railroad on Maryland's Eastern Shore. Our October fundraiser is the production of Edgar Allan Poe: His Tales of Terror. Our November fundraiser is tentatively planned to be another Old-Time Radio Show, and our December fundraiser is tentatively planned to be special production of A Christmas Carol.

### **GRANTS UPDATE**

The Maryland State Arts Council approved our application for Grants for Organization FY 2024, with funds totaling \$5,366.54. Congratulations go to Gary Finley, who wrote and submitted this grant application.

The Coastal Realtors Foundation granted us \$500 for general operating costs. The Beach to Bay Heritage Area granted us \$3000 and the Community Foundation of the Eastern Shore granted us \$2375 to support the special production of *Uncle Tom's Cabin and the Underground Railroad on Maryland's Eastern Shore*, which will be presented in September at various venues on Delmarva.

Although the Maryland State Arts Council did not approve a grant for a theater consultant, we are still reaching out to other grant makers to help us with funds in turning our rehearsal space into a performance space.
