- 1 .The first Tony Award for Best Musical was presented in 1949 to this musical.
- 2. The playwright of *The Crucible* and *Death of a Salesman* won the first Tony in 1947.
- 3. He won Tony awards for *Company*, *Sweeny Todd* and *Into the Woods* to name a few.
- 4. Carol Channing and Bette Midler both won a Tony playing this matchmaker from Yonkers.
- 5. This musical won Tony awards in 1995 and is nominated this year for the revival of Norma Desmond's story.
- 6. This Green Day musical won 2010 Tony awards for lighting and scenic design.
- 7. Danny Burstein and Aaron Tveit both won Tony awards for this musical; a theatrical celebration of truth, beauty, freedom and above all love set in Paris.
- 8. The original 1949 production won 10 Tonys, and the 2008 revival won seven. The most of any musical.
- 9. Choreographer with most Tony awards with eight, plus one for direction.
